Library and computer

We used our website to practice plural nouns and math facts.

<u>Literacy</u>

We read Animals Building Homes which focused on the importance of specific homes and how they are made. We also learned about main idea and details which will be carried into next week during our spider unit. Plural nouns were also reviewed which is a difficult skill, since there are various rules which we need to follow. Prefixes re- and un- were introduced. We also learned how to join subjects to form one sentence. Our stuffed animal writing and our sunshine similes made us really stretch our minds as to how we can use adjectives and similes to describe a noun.

<u>Math</u>

We continue to practice ways to help us become fluent in addition and subtraction. This week we related addition to subtraction. (fact families) We also practiced various ways to find the difference. One of these ways is using ten to subtract.

<u>Science</u>

This week we discussed what a seed looks like, how a seed grows, and how plants are alike and different. God created plant parts to help them survive in various environments.
