FROM THE PASTOR

Fasting to Feasting

Human beings possess both a body and a soul, and Jesus became man to redeem both. As St. Paul writes in Philippians 3:21 (NKJV), "[He] will transform our lowly body that it may be conformed to His glorious body, according to the working by which He is able even to subdue all things to Himself." Our bodies and souls are interconnected, not separate, and neither should be considered more important than the other. Though we are not saved by works, whether spiritual or bodily, physical discipline can yield spiritual benefits.

Fasting—abstaining from certain foods or all food for a time—has a long history in Christianity and is encouraged in Scripture. The prophet Joel urges, "Turn to Me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning" (Joel 2:12). Jesus assumes fasting will be part of Christian discipline but warns against hypocrisy: "When you fast, do not be like the hypocrites, with a sad countenance. For they disfigure their faces that they may appear to men to be fasting."

Fasting is not for boasting but is a physical discipline to support spiritual growth, drawing us closer to Jesus and reminding us of our dependence on Him. It should always be paired with prayer. When hunger or cravings strike, we turn to God, thanking Him for His abundant gifts, seeking strength for our resolve, and asking Him to deepen our faith.

Fasting also heightens our appreciation for what we abstain from once the fast ends. As Lent concludes and Easter begins, enjoy the feast with thanksgiving and praise to the Lord. Savor a second helping, your favorite drink, or a sweet treat, remembering the eternal banquet awaiting us in heaven. Whether fasting or feasting, do so with joy and gratitude to the Lord who has redeemed both body and soul.

FEED MY STARVING CHILDREN TRIP

Please join the Stewardship Board on Saturday, April 12th, for a spring field trip to Feed My Starving Children, a Christian organization in Libertyville, Illinois that utilizes volunteers to pack meals for children in need around the world.

Our group travelled to Feed My Starving Children twice in 2024. If you attended both times, individually you packed almost 1,200 meals!!!

Last September, our group was part of packing 122 boxes of food, which will feed 193 children for an entire year. That is 70,272 meals...and we are hoping to see those numbers grow this spring!!

Our packing time is from <u>2:00 pm - 3:45 pm</u>. We plan to meet at the Park and Ride on Highway 20 and leave at 12:45 pm to caravan down to Libertyville.

STEWARDSHIP CORNER - APRIL 2025

April 6 - Lent 5

Genesis 22:2 – "He said, 'Take your son, your only son Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah, and offer him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains of which I shall tell you." It's hard for us to even fathom a faith as strong as Abraham's — he follows the Lord's Word even when it seems impossibly hard. But he does so because he knows that the Lord only means to bless. What happened here to Abraham should be an encouragement for us: trust the Lord and keep His Word.

April 13 – Palm Sunday

Zechariah 9:9 – "Behold, your king is coming to you; righteous and having salvation is he, humble and mounted on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey." No king ever rode to war like this. But no king had ever come to wage battle by dying. In His Passion, our Lord Jesus gives everything He has and is; He does this to bring us from death to life, to make us His own people, and show us an example of self-giving love that we should follow.

April 20 - Easter

John 20:1 – "Now on the first day of the week ..." All is made new by the resurrection of Jesus! Even the day of worship has transitioned from the Old Testament's Sabbath (Saturday) to the Lord's Day of the New Testament (Sunday). For the Lord has made all things new: In rising from the dead as the new Adam, He has begun a new week for a new creation. We are also made new in Him — a new heart, a new life, new desires, a new outlook toward God. All this comes from our risen Lord's grace. Especially after the sort of year we've had since last Easter, it sure is good news to hear that the Lord makes all things start afresh!

April 27 – Easter 2 (Quasimodo geniti)

John 20:19 – "Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, 'Peace be with you." The peace we have in Jesus is what makes a life of good works possible. Since we know that it is Jesus who saved us, and not our works, we are now free to do good works not out of self-interest, but for the right reasons: out of thanksgiving toward God and love for our neighbors.

<u>LIFE THOUGHTS FOR LUTHERANS –</u> APRIL 2025

April 6 – Lent V (Judica) – The Lord God forbade father Abraham from sacrificing his boy Isaac (Genesis 22:12). The lesson extends to us, too. Abortion is immoral because it is unnecessary. Jesus alone serves as beast of burden in the solemn rite of righting wrongs (Hebrews 9:14). This Word has become flesh in order to deliver humankind entirely from the death business (John 8:51). And we get to keep this Word precisely by giving it to neighbors.

April 13 – Palm Sunday/Passion of Our Lord (Palmarum) – Sinful nature prizes popularity, property, and power. It despises dependence and discards aging or gestating neighbors because of it. But Jesus proves that God has designed humankind to rely on Him and each other. His salvation comes about by humbly and happily entrusting oneself to an Almighty Father (Philippians 2:6-8). We need not take life and death into our own hands when we can rest upon His.

April 20 – Resurrection of Our Lord – The Scriptures do not limit the sanctity of human life to a few isolated passages. Almighty God has made abundant and everlasting life the point of the whole story. He intends His resurrection to encompass and affect every member of our race and every moment of our existence from fertilization to forever. Nobody need redo death now that Jesus Christ is undoing it!

April 27 – Easter II (Quasimodo Geniti) – Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed (John 20:29) that even an embryo is a life worth having. Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed that even becoming incapacitated or uncommunicative is a life worth living. Blessed are we who believe the Risen Savior proves every life precious, even where mortal eyes behold only despair (Ezekiel 37:5-6)!

REFLECTIONS ON EASTER AND OUR SHUT-INS

Easter Sunday is GLORIOUS here at St. John's! We are blessed with a spectacularly beautiful sanctuary that will be brightened with arrays of spring flowers and an empty tomb. The Hallelujah Chorus brings tingles to our spines and the congregational singing of "I Know That My Redeemer Lives" can reduce any of us to tears of joy. Even if you didn't grow up at St. John's, you know there is no day more glorious here than the celebration of Easter.

But there are members of our church family who can't be with us on that day and will only be able to call upon their memories to remember what we still get to be a part of. This is not a message of sadness though; on the contrary, this is a message of an opportunity for **joyous service!** When we truly reflect on Jesus securing our salvation for us, the joy within us should be shared!
