NEWS FROM ST. JOHN'S August 2022

FROM THE PASTOR

This month we continue to focus on those whom we commemorate in the Lutheran Church throughout the year. In the month of August, we begin with Joanna, Mary, and Salome and their work as myrrhbearers to the tomb of our Lord (8/3). From there, we remember Lawrence, a deacon and martyr (8/10), Mary, the mother of our Lord (8/15), Isaac (8/16), Johann Gerhard, a Lutheran theologian (8/17), Bernard of Clairvaux (8/19), the prophet Samuel (8/20), and the apostle Bartholomew (8/24). We come to the end of the month by remembering a mother and son, Monica (8/27) and Augustine of Hippo (8/28).

At Jesus' burial, his tomb was known by the three women remembered each year on August 3. Joanna, whose husband was a servant in King Herod's house, Mary, the mother of James, and Salome, the mother of two of Jesus' closest disciples James and John took their spices in order to give a proper burial. They observed the placing of His dead body in the tomb, and then, as the day ended, observed the Sabbath rest for all of the next day. Then, early Sunday morning, they went out before the sun had risen to offer this final act of reverence and love for Jesus. The myrrh they brought, which He had first received after His birth from the Magi, proved unnecessary. The tomb was open and there was no body to anoint! Their diligence and commitment to serve the Lord even after His death offers us an important reminder to use what we have to give Him glory. Of course, His resurrection proves that the darkness of death cannot stand against the light of His salvation.

Lawrence, remembered on August 10, served not as a pastor but as a deacon in the Church. He was arrested along with a number of clergy during a worship service in AD 256. As a deacon, he oversaw the church's treasury and was commanded by Roman authorities to turn it over to them. Lawrence asked for three days to get it organized, and instead spent those three days distributing as much of it as he could to those in need. He was martyred as a result, speaking of his Christian confidence and joy as flames surrounded him.

Monica, remembered on August 27, lived in North Africa from AD 333-387. Her life is a picture of a loving mother who was committed to praying for her wayward son. Though her husband was converted to Christianity before his death, she had great concern for her son Augustine. In time, and following much prayer, he came to the faith and was baptized by Ambrose of Milan. Augustine would go on to contribute greatly as a Church Father and as the bishop of Hippo (known today as Algeria). He is known for his defense of the Biblical concept of salvation coming by grace alone, which comes from Paul's words in Ephesians 2:8-9 and serves as a foundation of Luther's work over 1000 years later in the Reformation. In looking at the lives of these two servants of the Lord, this prayer is fitting for all those who are waiting for their loved ones to come to the faith:

"O Lord, you strengthened your patient servant Monica through spiritual discipline to persevere in offering her love, her prayers, and her tears for the conversation of her husband and of Augustine, their son. Deepen our devotion to bring others, even our own family, to acknowledge Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord, who with you and the Holy Spirit, lives and reigns, one God, now and forever. Amen."

God's blessings to us all as the month of August goes forward and these commemorations take place!

LIFE THOUGHTS FOR LUTHERANS – AUGUST 2022

Trinity VIII – The relaxing lies our culture prophesies cannot even approach our Lord's promises (Jeremiah 23:16-18). We speak the Gospel of Jesus Christ boldly and gladly (Jeremiah 23:28-29), though it earns us persecution, because He sets great joy before us. In this faith we will sit around His throne with the cloud of witnesses His Word saved. *Lamb of God, You have given me Your people's crown of life; forge in me Your prophets' faith. Amen.*

Trinity IX – Temptations to idolatry exist today as they did in biblical times. The great idol "Death" draws many to its altar. They look to death for rescue from a crisis pregnancy or chronic disease or pain. Death's allure is so great it even tempts Christians to bow before it. But we have a way out of such temptations to faithlessness: "God is faithful" (1 Corinthians 10:1-13). Christ our "Rock" never leaves us (10:4). We can trust in Him. Rock of our salvation, may Your faithful service to us through Your cross and resurrection move us to be faithful to You. Amen.

Trinity X – With God's prophets we call the culture around us to turn away from the destruction they are bringing upon themselves (Jeremiah 8:5, 11; Luke 19:43-44). With us they each remain precious to Jesus, who by His visitation in the flesh (Luke 19:44) for forgiveness delivers the Gospel that makes for peace (Luke 19:42) and righteousness (Romans 10:4). *O Lord God, intervene and redeem our people that we may behold and inhabit Your kingdom. Amen.*

Trinity XI – Heaven and earth grieve every life ended by another (Genesis 4:10). Worse yet is believing ourselves any better than murderers (Luke 18:11-14). Lord God regards all as precious as little babies, and His Son's forgiving Word and works of faith rescue from death's mouth when tempted (Genesis 4:7) and from hell's mouth when guilty (Genesis 4:15). *Merciful Father, intervene that we may be saved and safe from death and hell. Amen.*

BOCDS POLICY UPDATE

Policy 3.12 was advanced at the Board of Christian Day School meeting on Wednesday, July 20. According to Policy 2.03, the policy must be shared with our church and school body. 3.12 Field Trips

Teachers are encouraged to take the students on educational field trips.

Procedures for field trips are as follows:

- 1. Clear the date and place with the principal.
- 2. Parents should be notified by the teacher prior to the field trip.
- 3. Students will be transported by bus for all field trips. When available, students will be transported by bus for field trips. The teacher will make the necessary arrangements to reserve a bus prior to the field trip. There will be situations where a bus is not available to transport students to a field trip. In this situation, a teacher may ask parents to drive the students to the field trip destination. When parents are asked to drive, they will need to complete a Parent Volunteer Screening & Agreement (Student Field Trips) Form. In addition, each family in the class will need to fill out a Field Trip Agreement & Participation form.
- 4. Secure sufficient adult supervision.
 - Any parents who chaperone field trips will be responsible for their own admission and/or other expenses.
 - Chaperones are expected to abide by the chaperone policy.
- 5. Avoid conflicts with school calendar.
