FROM THE PASTOR

On Continuing Education

We as Lutherans have a tradition and legacy of excellence in catechesis and education. This is obviously true and most clearly shown with the effort and resources that we pour into our Lutheran schools. St. John's only took one year from its founding to open the school, and this was for good reason. We not only want our children to be set up for worldly success but to be faithful and devout Christians both in their homes and in the community. But though these schools are a valuable resource, we must not become complacent with continuing education in adulthood. We have a tendency as fickle human beings to forget or be misled by false doctrine.

"And he gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ, so that we may no longer be children, tossed to and fro by the waves and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by human cunning, by craftiness in deceitful schemes." [Ephesians 4:11-14]

It is likewise true there is simply always more to learn. Pastors and teachers are required to attend conferences which, in part, include continuing education. Doctors and nurses are required to do the same in order to keep up to date with changes and new information. Although our doctrine remains the same, the world around us is constantly changing. How we respond to the world around us therefore likewise changes. We need to continue to be equipped to properly understand and address these changes. In part, this is why we offer Adult Bible Class and encourage even lifelong Lutherans to re-take our New Member Class. But though you are urged to take advantage of these opportunities, there are many other resources that you can draw upon. Podcasts, for example, have become all the rage nowadays and for good reasons. They give us an opportunity to reflect and learn in a way that is engaging and fits our schedules and the busyness of our hectic lives. I want to encourage you to consider making a good Lutheran podcast part of your daily life. Just a few of these options include Issues Etc., KFUO, and more recently the On The Line podcast. All three bring knowledgeable laymen and clergy to speak on topics ranging from politics and society, reflections on the lectionary readings for the coming week, and other theological topics. All three examples are specifically aimed at you, laymen and laywomen who are navigating a sinful and broken world in your life at home and as you go out into the world. Do not neglect your own private devotions, the reading of scripture, bible study, and attendance in church. But do add to those things this easy way to learn more about the faith, to be encouraged in your own life of faith, and to stay up to date with how the church responds to the many changes of the world. STEWARDSHIP CORNER - DECEMBER 2024

December 1 – Advent I

Matthew 21:3 – "If anyone says anything to you, you shall say, 'The Lord needs them,' and he will send them at once." – Consider the faithfulness of that man who owned the donkey and colt. All he needed to hear was, "The Lord has need of it," and he willingly gave. The Lord has given each of us various callings in life (in our homes, in the church and in the communities we live in). In each calling we have good work to do which comes from the Lord's hand. The Lord has need of us in each calling. How is He calling you to generous giving in each of your vocations?

December 8 – Advent II

Luke 21:28 – "Now when these things begin to take place, straighten up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near." When the world starts to fall apart, when things go badly, when nation rises against nation, Jesus tells us to lift up our heads because redemption is nigh. What a wonderful reminder that we Christians really do have nothing to fear! Jesus has conquered and He will deliver the full victory to us in His second Advent. Therefore we are free to live godly, generous, faithful lives here and now, for we have nothing to be afraid of.

December 15 – Advent III

Luke 3:4 – "As it is written in the book of the words of Isaiah the prophet, "The voice of one crying in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight." God makes long-range plans: Isaiah lived more than seven hundred years before St. John the Baptist preached by the Jordan River. Obviously, God sees farther into the future than we do! That's yet another reason to trust Him when it comes to how He tells us to live our lives: He knows what's coming and we don't.

December 22 – Advent IV

Philippians 4:5–6 – "The Lord is at hand; do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God." Wouldn't you like to be free from worry and anxiety? Isn't it worry and anxiety that often keep us from living the generous life God has called us to? St. Paul contrasts anxiety with prayer, supplication and thanksgiving in making our requests known to God. In other words, when you are tempted to anxiety and worry, pray to the Lord with a thankful heart and pour out your supplications before Him.

Dec. 24 – Christmas Eve

Luke 2:11 – "For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord." We give gifts at Christmas time because God gave the greatest gift at Christmas. That's how it always works: God acts, and we imitate. That's what it means to grow in faith — to grow more into the image of God in what we think, say and do.

Dec. 25 – Christmas Day

John 1:12 – "But to all who did receive Him, who believed in His name, He gave the right to become children of God." In the beginning we were made in God's image. When Adam and Eve sinned, the image was tarnished, and in some ways, it was even lost. But Christ has come to restore us, to make us God's children again, to restore the image of God within us. The Christian life is a life of growing into that image, of struggling against sin and striving to imitate our Lord in His mercy, generosity, love, faithfulness and kindness. December 29 – Christmas I

Luke 2:38 – "And coming up at that very hour she began to give thanks to God and to speak of Him to all who were waiting for the redemption of Jerusalem." Notice here how giving thanks to God leads to good works (speaking about Jesus, in this case). Thankfulness toward God for all He has done for us is the foundation of a Christian life lived in godliness. For if we know all that the Lord has done for us, how can we not strive to honor Him with what we think, say and do?

December 31 – New Year's Eve / January 1 – New Year's Day

Luke 2:21 – "And at the end of eight days, when he was circumcised, he was called Jesus, the name given by the angel before he was conceived in the womb." So how was your 2024? What are you looking forward to (with either joy or dread) in 2025? No matter our joys or our sorrows, this is certain: last year and next year belong to Jesus. And His very name is a comfort to us, for He is called Jesus because He will save His people from their sins, as the angel said. As you begin a new year, rest in that knowledge.

LIFE THOUGHTS FOR LUTHERANS – DECEMBER 2024

Advent I – "The Lord is our righteousness" (Jeremiah 23:6b). What comforting truth for hearts troubled with sin's guilt that keeps resurfacing. Sometimes a past sin can be so haunting that we do not always feel forgiven, or we cannot forgive ourselves. The sin of abortion is a prime example. But our righteousness does not depend upon us or our feelings. Our righteousness is Christ! *Prayer: O Lord our Righteousness, may my comfort and hope be anchored in You and not my feelings. Amen.*

Advent II – No matter what sufferings we carry or how weary we become, Jesus provides hope-filled news about His second coming. Christ has won the victory, and when He returns death and evil will be vanquished. We will be "leaping like calves from the stall" (Malachi 4:1-3). "[S]traighten up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near" (Luke 21:28). Some things are worth waiting for even amid suffering!

Advent III – "Speak tenderly" in Isaiah 40:1-2 is literally "speak to the heart." More than nicesounding words, all of the Good News encapsulated in the first and second coming of Jesus speaks powerfully to those with struggling and burdened hearts. The life issues give us opportunity to speak this Good News to matters of the heart, especially those considered "controversial" and "divisive." *Prayer: Thank You for touching our hearts with the Good News! Help us share it with all who deal with matters of the heart. Amen.*

Advent IV/Christmas Eve – Jesus brought God delicately amidst sinners, as humble in crucifixion as He was helpless in conception. Yet this estate did not hinder but, in fact, heralded the full realm and reign of God for us. And thereby He reaffirmed the worth of even the feeblest human beings. God's gift of life arrives all the better for the plain packaging He habitually hides it behind. *Prayer: Lamb of God, make it so that our taking hold of You leads us to cradle Your little ones as well. Amen.*

Christmas I/New Year's Eve – A peaceful departure (Luke 2:29) may not always mean the absence of pain and suffering. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, it is seeing the presence of our Savior accomplishing His will according to His timetable. *Prayer: In our last hour, dear Savior, help us see You and be at peace. Amen.*
