In January, and at the start of a new year, we talk about dropping bad habits and starting up new ones. I hope you'll find a way to add Twelve Minutes a Day that you can dedicate to hearing the Lord as He speaks through His Word!

Some of you are already in the habit of spending time in God's Word each day. This is a very good habit, and one that is fitting for every Christian! Martin Luther is said to have released God's Word among the people through his translation work. He began in while in hiding, after Pope Leo X declared him a heretic and sought his life. Rather than feeling sorry for himself and moping about, he used his time well at the Wartburg castle. There he translated the New Testament into German, over the course of roughly eleven weeks, and with the help of the recently invented printing press, God's Word was placed into the hands of the people.

The Bible is available in a great many languages and translations, including English of course. It is accessible through daily reading apps on a smartphone, or by opening a printed copy and using a good old-fashioned bookmark!

I encourage you to take a look at how you spend your free time, either as an individual or as a family if you live with others in your home. I'm certain you can find twelve minutes every day to examine once more the promises God has set apart for those who love Him. If you do it, you can get through the whole of Holy Scripture over the course of this new year!

God's blessings as we enter into 2026 together! Please note, this is a shorter 'From the Pastor' segment in order for you to get a jump start.

CHURCH ROOF UPDATE

The church roof replacement and painting of the fascia metal has been paid in full. Through member special gifts and leaf purchases we have raised approximately \$142,000.00. The remainder came from member memorials, and funds from the designated renovation account. The complete project cost was approximately \$500,000.00. Thank you for your support and special gifts to help defray the cost of the roof project. You can still 'leaf out' our tree branches by purchasing a leaf for our tree. There are three different levels to choose from: Gold for \$300, silver for \$200, and bronze for \$100. There are order forms available at the back of the sanctuary, in the church office and attached to emails that Kimberly sends out.

STEWARDSHIP CORNER – JANUARY

January 4 – Second Sunday after Christmas

1 Peter 4:17 – "For it is time for judgment to begin at the household of God; and if it begins with us, what will be the outcome for those who do not obey the gospel of God?" The Gospel had freed us from all fear. God the Father loves us to the ends of love, and He has sent His Son to die for us and call us into His kingdom through the rebirth of water and Spirit. Saint Peter views this not as an excuse to sin but as encouragement for godly living. The judgment of the Lord is a real event, and it applies to the household of God. As members of His household, we desire to serve Him.

January 6 - The Epiphany of Our Lord

Matthew 2:11 – "And going into the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother, and they fell down and worshiped him. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts, gold and frankincense and myrrh." For the wise men and for us, worshiping and offering gifts go together. How could this not be, since our God is the great Giver of gifts? We receive His gifts in worship and then, being conformed to His image, we imitate His generosity.

January 11 - The Baptism of Our Lord

Matthew 3:15 – "But Jesus answered him, 'Let it be so now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness." God sent His Son into the world to fulfill all righteousness for us, to do what we could not do. Here, Jesus plunges Himself into our sins and soaks them up in His Baptism, so that in our Baptism we might be cleansed and renewed. The whole of Jesus' life, everything He did and said, was one great offering to the Father in our stead to fulfill all righteousness for us. All our offerings back to our Lord are in thanksgiving for this one great, true offering.

January 18 - Second Sunday after Epiphany

Ephesians 5:27 – "So that he might present the church to himself in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish." Our Lord has cleansed us with His blood — in His sight we are now pure and holy. He has given Himself, laying down His life for us. Now we are His spotless and beautiful bride. By His sacrifice, we are moved to sacrifice. By His cleansing, we find a desire to ourselves be clean and live blamelessly as He is blameless.

January 25 - The Transfiguration of Our Lord

Matthew 17:8 – "And when they lifted up their eyes, they saw no one but Jesus only." Jesus is enough. Moses and Elijah point to Jesus and are happy to fade into the background. With our eyes focused on Him and Him alone, the rest of our lives come into focus. He is primary, all else is secondary. When that order is right in our lives, things truly fall into place.

"SHUT-IN'S" NOT "SHUT-OUT'S"

I want to thank everyone who has reached out to our St. John's shut-ins. Your efforts make them feel "not shut-out".
