FROM THE PASTOR

God bless our native land; Firm may she ever stand Through storm and night. When the wild tempests rave, Ruler of wind and wave, Do Thou our country save By Thy great might. (LSB 965)

The month of July brings many things, most famously our nation's celebration of the freedom and independence we enjoy. Racine does the Fourth of July quite well with the parade in the morning and the fireworks over Lake Michigan at night. It's something my family and I look forward to every year, and members of our extended family have timed visits in the past around it.

When examining all that comes with any celebration, it's important to remember what is at its heart. In between Memorial Day and Labor Day we find Independence Day, which points to those who sacrificed their lives for the freedom we enjoy and are able to use in productive and professional ways.

There are many blessings that we can see which God has given to us as a nation. We do well to put to use all that He has given us, including the freedoms secured through the work of our founding fathers. Many of them looked to God's Word for direction and confessed Jesus as Lord. God's Law is the undeniable source of the laws that are used to oversee our nation.

With this in mind, there is also an observable shift away from the authority of God's Word in our culture. There are many ways that our nation has forgotten the importance of taking guidance and comfort from what He offers us in it as He points us to the salvation that comes only by the sacrificial life, death, and resurrection of His Son for us and for all people.

From various losses on the battlefield to the destruction of Solomon's temple (II Kings 25:1-21) to its rebuilding on a much smaller scale (Ezra 3:8-13—and pay close attention to the last two verses) to even that temple being destroyed by Rome in AD 70, which Jesus foretold a number of times, including during the week He made His way to the cross (Matthew 24:1-2).

In this life, in this country, you and I enjoy many freedoms due to the sacrifice of the family that came before us, the minds far brighter than mine that founded this nation, those who fought and died representing us all, and all the more, through the Word of Goddelivered to us personally through the incarnation of our Lord Jesus Christ in His victory over sin and death. Being a Christian in the United States of America is easier than in some other nations, and we do well to use this as an opportunity to reflect the love of God through His Word to all those around us. The easiest way to do it is to be where He promises to meet us through the New Covenant established with all the world through the means of grace.

I hope you all have an enjoyable Fourth of July, either here in town or somewhere else being together with people you know and love. I hope even more that you keep in mind that God oversees all things. Oh, and I'm glad July 4th skipped a Wednesday due to the Leap Year, so we can still hold our 6:00 pm evening service on July 3!

Please keep these ideas in mind as we make our way through this month, and join us each week for the Divine Service throughout the summer! STEWARDSHIP CORNER – JULY 2024

July 7 – Trinity 6

Matthew 5:24 – "First be reconciled to your brother, and then come and offer your gift." First things first: the Lord won't be bribed by our giving. Our giving must flow forth from a faithful Christian life that receives Christ's forgiveness and freely shares that forgiveness. Or, in other words, a good work isn't a good work if it doesn't flow from faith.

July 14 – Trinity 7

Romans 6:22 – "But now that you have been set free from sin and have become slaves of God, the fruit you get leads to sanctification and its end, eternal life." The fruits of faith in Christ are the good works of a faithful Christian life. We have received grace upon grace in the free forgiveness of our sins, and so we are now free to go forth and bear fruit in serving our neighbor in the home, the church and society.

July 21 – Trinity 8

Romans 8:16 – "The Spirit Himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God." Children are called to grow up into the image of their Father. That's the basis not only of our generosity, but of our entire life as Christians. God sets the pattern and we follow. God is kind to us in Christ, and so we desire to be kind. God is loving to us in Christ, and so we desire to love. God is generous and open-handed to us in Christ, and so we desire to be generous and open-handed.

July 28 – Trinity 9

Luke 16:8–9 – "For the sons of this world are more shrewd in dealing with their own generation than the sons of light. And I tell you, make friends for yourselves by means of unrighteous wealth, so that when it fails they may receive you into the eternal dwellings." The things of this world, including wealth, are merely tools. They can be used for good or ill. They can be squandered or used efficiently. How we use them will be determined by what is most important to us. What is most important to you in your life? Does the way you use the things of this world reflect that?

<u>LIFE THOUGHTS FOR LUTHERANS –</u> JULY 2024

Trinity VI – The death Jesus died, He died "once for all" (Romans 6:10). He purchased "all." Thus, He gives value to "all." Every person we encounter, no matter their size or location or condition of health, is someone for whom Jesus died. Our responsibility is to acknowledge their value and lead them to see its true source. *Loving Savior, reflect Your self-giving mercy and devotion in us. Amen.*

Trinity VII – Jesus declares and demonstrates compassion even for those who cannot feed themselves or walk on their own (Mark 8:1-3). He who breathes life into each human body (Genesis 2:7) also provides everything necessary to survive (Mark 8:8) and promises all the abundance of Eden's paradise in the gift of eternal life (Romans 6:23). And He mercifully involves us in this miraculous ministry (Mark 8:5-8)! Almighty Maker, show through us the life-giving compassion You have shown to us. Amen.

Trinity VIII – The relaxing lies our culture prophesies cannot even approach our Lord's promises (Jeremiah 23:16-18). We speak the Gospel of Jesus Christ boldly and gladly (Jeremiah 23:28-29), though it earns us persecution, because He sets great joy before us. In this faith we will sit around His throne with the cloud of witnesses His Word saved. Lamb of God, You have given me Your people's crown of life; forge in me Your prophets' faith. Amen.

Trinity IX – Temptations to idolatry exist today as they did in biblical times. The great idol "Death" draws many to its altar. They look to death for rescue from a crisis pregnancy or chronic disease or pain. Death's allure is so great it even tempts Christians to bow before it. But we have a way out of such temptations to faithlessness: "God is faithful" (1 Corinthians 10:1-13). Christ our "Rock" never leaves us (10:4). We can trust in Him. Rock of our salvation, may Your faithful service to us through Your cross and resurrection move us to be faithful to You. Amen.
