STEWARDSHIP CORNER - MAY 2025

<u>May 4 – Misericordia Domini</u>

John 10:16 – "And I have other sheep that are not of this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice." On their own sheep are in great danger. They need a shepherd to guide them. The sheep know the Shepherd's voice, and we delight to go where He leads. Of course, the world, the devil and our own sinful flesh want to pull us in another direction. Namely, they want to pull us in the direction of death. But following the Shepherd means life. So, no matter how difficult the path is, let us follow the Shepherd!

May 11 – Jubilate

1 Peter 2:11 – "Beloved, I urge you as sojourners and exiles to abstain from the passions of the flesh, which wage war against your soul." Passions of the flesh — that means the things our flesh desires. One way to sum up all the "passions of the flesh" is to call them greed: the desire to have more things to bring us comfort and peace of mind. But that shows us the real problem with greed. It wages war against our soul, and it urges us to place our trust in the things of this world and not in God. But St. Peter reminds us that we are sojourners and exiles. We belong to the kingdom of God. We have been purchased by the blood of Christ and belong to Him. That knowledge frees us from greed, and it frees us for generosity.

<u>May 18 – Cantate</u>

James 1:17 – "Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change." The thought James captures here is repeated over and over again in the Bible. Everything good we have is from God. He loves to give. He loves to bless. He loves to show us generosity time and again. And He desires that we grow into His image and reflect His love. That is why God wants us to give to the ministry of His church. God can do anything He wants to without our help. But He commands us to give so that we will grow in our imitation of His own generosity.

<u> May 25 – Rogate</u>

James 1:22 – "But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves." Martin Luther said this about our faith: "Oh, it is a living, busy, active, mighty thing, this faith. And so it is impossible for it not to do good works incessantly." The Word of God is not merely to be heard, but to be received and believed, and implemented. James reminds us of this, and he encourages us to examine our lives and come to repentance, where we can see that we are not living out our faith in sincerity.

May 29 – Ascension Day

Acts 1:11 – "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into heaven? This Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw Him go into heaven." Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ is ascended, and Christ will come again. We live our lives in this world in the sure confidence of the world to come. We live as people who know our Lord Jesus and who know that He is coming back. This makes all the difference in how we approach our stewardship and how we prioritize our lives.

Every man according as he purposes in his heart, so let him give; not grudgingly, or of necessity: for God loves a cheerful giver.

LIFE THOUGHTS FOR LUTHERANS – MAY 2025

May 4 – Easter III (Misericordias Domini) – The Good Shepherd means for His whole flock to walk through death's shadow (Psalm 23:4), not to lie down or leave one another there. Abandoning embryos, elders, or any other neighbor to abortion or assisted suicide amounts to devilish thievery (John 10:12-13). When our voices rise and our hands reach to bind up the injured and strengthen the weak (Ezekiel 34:16), then we know real goodness and mercy (Psalm 23:6).

May 11 – Easter IV (Jubilate) – "Silence." "Dust." "Strikes." "Insults." "Grief." Lamentations knows right where it hurts. And this Word of the Lord gives us a God who comforts just how each needs: "steadfast love," "mercies," "faithfulness," "salvation," "compassion," and "abundance." Let us diagnose abortion by naming it sinfulness, so that we may directly dispense the healing that the hearts it has broken long for.

May 18 – Easter V (Cantate) – The people of Christ do not sit still or stay silent. We shout, sing, praise, and bless (Psalm 66:1-2, 8). May we each raise our Gospel-motivated voice For Life to advocate against death as the ultimate consequence of sinfulness (James 1:15) and to celebrate every neighbor from the youngest to the oldest among us (James 1:27) as a good gift from the loving Father (James 1:17).

May 25 – Easter VI (Rogate) – Surprise pregnancy and terminal diagnosis come with risks and costs. But as with the ancient Israelite serpent infestation, the real enemy is neither one's neighbor nor the Maker (Numbers 21:8). Only impaling the snake (not terminating each other) brought deliverance, and the antidote called for faith instead of death. Christians insist that real truth and love celebrate every last human life as worth having (1 Timothy 2:4-5).

SENDING WORDS AS MAY FLOWERS TO OUR SHUT-INS

The month of May brings delight in so many ways...longer daylight, the sounds of birds and most of all the vibrant color and wonderful scent of blooming flowers. This is truly God's handiwork, and he created it for us to enjoy and share. Consider sharing with our shut-ins words of encouragement, support and hope that our Risen Lord wants us to share. Your kindness will certainly be flowers to them. They are truly part of our St. John's family who can no longer worship with us on Sundays in our beautiful sanctuary. Be a "May Flower" to one or more of our shut-ins.
