## LIFE THOUGHTS FOR LUTHERANS – SEPTEMBER 2024

**Trinity XIV** – Jesus' merciful words and ways work life and healing (Proverbs 4:20-22). He brings forth brilliant and abundant fruit (Galatians 5:22-23) even from flesh like ours (Galatians 5:19-21) that was born broken. We who take these words to heart—and the hearts we touch with them—will live indeed. *Gracious Savior, bring life to us and bring life through us. Amen.*

**Trinity XV** – Our God Jesus has set us free from sin, death, and the power of the devil. He also gives us the gift of dependence, to depend upon Him in faith and on one another in love and service (Galatians 6:2). Rather than diminishing our humanity, mutual dependence dignifies it. *Lord Jesus, help me to depend upon You with Your people and defend those who depend upon me. Amen.*

**Trinity XVI** – In both the Old Testament and Gospel readings we see the ultimate miracle, sons raised from the dead (1 Kings 17:17-24, Luke 7:11-17). Yet they present but a tiny picture of what will happen because God raised His Son from the dead! All the dead in Christ will be raised to eternal life. Death is a defeated enemy! *Prayer: Lord, may Your defeat of death give us courage as we confront a culture of death. Amen.*

**Trinity XVII** – In Christ God embraced and befriended hearts and bodies ruined by sin. He allowed neither disabilities nor disobedience to separate anyone from His love (Luke 14:1-4). This forgiveness heals us to share the same gracious kingdom with the ones right in front of us who struggle with impairment and iniquity (Luke 14:12-14). *Prayer: Extend Your kingdom, Lord Jesus, through me to those who are broken like I am. Amen.*

**Trinity XVIII** – Those who see abortion as just “another issue” and would support or encourage a woman to make such a choice fail to understand the scriptural concept of “neighbor” and have a false sense of what it means to love. Those who see both mother and unborn child as “neighbor” and take action to bring help and hope fulfill the second greatest commandment in the Law and reflect the love of Christ (Matthew 22:34-40).

## STEWARDSHIP CORNER – SEPTEMBER 2024

Sept. 1 – Trinity 14

**Luke 17:18–19** – “[Jesus answered,] ‘Was no one found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?’ And he said to him, ‘Rise and go your way; your faith has made you well.’” Faith and thanksgiving go together. How could they not go together? Our Lord gave Himself for us and we trust Him and His every Word. Once we have this faith, we want to say thank you — it’s only natural. And thus, our stewardship is a natural part of the Christian faith. We thank the Lord with our gifts which enable the church to reach more people with the Good News of Christ.

Sept. 8 – Trinity 15

**Matthew 6:24** – “You cannot serve God and money.” In today’s Gospel, Jesus gives the first and last word about our stewardship — well, you have to go back a few verses to verse 19 to get the whole thing: “For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.” Read Matt. 5:19–34 again this week at home and consider your generosity to the Lord’s work in light of what Jesus says.

Sept. 15 – Trinity 16

**Ephesians 3:14–15** – “For this reason I bow my knees before the Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth is named.” We don’t call our heavenly Father by that name by analogy to our earthly fathers — it’s the other way around: God sets the pattern and image for earthly fathers to follow. He is the real and true Father: kind, loving, strong, faithful, generous, righteous and self-sacrificing. Knowing this Father is the basis for growing into His image, which is the goal of our sanctification.

Sept 22. – Trinity 17

**Luke 14:5** – “And he said to them, ‘Which of you, having a son or an ox that has fallen into a well on a Sabbath day, will not immediately pull him out?’” The time is always ripe to do right. God is always calling us to faithfulness and love, which is the fulfillment of the Law. The Pharisees wanted an easier law, something less than love, which was easier to keep. Why? Because they thought they had to in order to be saved. But since we know that Jesus saves by His sacrifice, we are free to see the real Law of love and to strive to fulfill it not out of fear, but out of thanksgiving.

Sept. 29 – Trinity 18

**1 Corinthians 1:4** – “I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that was given you in Christ Jesus.” The grace of God and thanksgiving go together. When God gives to us, thankfulness wells up inside of us. How could it not? And as Paul shows us here, it’s not only the grace given to us that causes us to give thanks, but even the grace given to others. We certainly have much to be thankful for when we look at the gifts of grace all around us.

## VARIOUS FUNDS AND SPECIAL OFFERING INFORMATION

**Endowment Fund:** To perpetuate all parish programs. The purpose of the Endowment Fund is to receive and administer gifts and primarily for the enhancement and furthering the work and ministry of St. John’s Congregation, the enhancement and extension of the LCMS, and for the benefit of other worthwhile Christian programs and projects.

**Rev. A.C. Schaefer Scholarship Fund:** For the training of pastors and teachers. The purpose of this fund is to encourage and assist qualified persons to prepare for professional church work in The Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod.

**St. John’s School Technology Fund:** Donations to this fund help in the purchasing of technology materials such as chrome books, Smartboards, laptops, printers, internet, etc. for St. John’s Lutheran School.

**Renovation for Church and School:** Any monies given to the renovation of the church and school goes into an account specifically designated for renovation costs that occur at both our church and school. At times, there will be specific requests for renovation project donations.

**Altar Guild:** The Altar Guild uses funds to purchase communion elements, floral arrangements as necessary, and various other projects overseen by the Altar Guild and the pastors.

**Families in Need:** The Families in Need fund is designed to help member families that are struggling financially. This may include help with paying bills, buying groceries, or other needs that may arise. The Stewardship Board along with the pastors at St. John’s oversee this program.

**Congregation Approved Capital Expense Fund:** These are funds that are set aside in a designated checking account to be used for larger projects or special expenditures as approved by the congregation. As part of the annual budget process, money is already being set aside monthly in this account. Donations to fund these congregational projects are also accepted into this account.
