FROM THE PASTOR

"Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends" (John 15:13).

God's love motivated Him to create us and all things. He spoke His Word into nothing and the result is everything we see and know in this life. His love furthers His creation and He cares for all that He has made. As sin made its way into all that He had made, His love prompted Him to promise a rescue through His Son.

The season of Lent is, by design, a more somber and subdued time of the church year. It is a penitential season, one that draws our attention to our sin and our need for a Savior. The hymns we sing carry a sadder tune and focus on that which was required of our Lord to free us from our sin. It is an important part of the year as well, a reminder of how serious our sin is.

In our world, there is certainly talk of love and there is evidence of it. Unfortunately, the most prominent love that we find in our culture is the love of self. While the world calls it different things, God in His Word calls us away from our natural selfish ways. Many people, including well-intended Christians, falsely believe that life is about being happy or finding happiness. To be sure, there are many blessings God shares with us that elicit happiness in our lives, but He also cautions us to recognize that following Him does not promise a happy way forward.

In the end, as Jesus' words to His disciples in John 15:13 show us, His love is found in the giving up of Himself for the benefit of those He loves. He willingly went to the cross, sacrificing His very life, in order that we would have His love and forgiveness through the faith planted in our hearts through His Word.

God's blessings as we anticipate the season of Lent, beginning with Pre-Lent, or Gesimatide, which make up the three Sundays before Ash Wednesday (2/14). Take the time again this year to examine what ways you can show love not for yourself, but for those around you here at St. John's and in your daily lives.

ABOUT THE "GESIMAS"

On January 28, we entered into a season of the church year before Lent called the season of Septuagesima or "Pre-Lent." This is made up of the three Sundays (Septuagesima, Sexagesima, Quinquagesima) which come between the feast of Transfiguration and Ash Wednesday. The names are Latin for the number of days before Easter. Quinquagesima is exactly 50 days before Easter, Sexagesima 57 days, and Septuagesima is 64 days before Easter. This season serves as a transition between the celebratory season of Epiphany and the penitential season of Lent. During this time, we omit the *Gloria in Excelsis* and the *Alleluia* as we prepare ourselves for the penitential season of Lent.

We are looking forward to our traditional Lenten dinners again this year. The Board of Elders has offered to hold the first dinner on Ash Wednesday, February 14. STEWARDSHIP CORNER – FEBRUARY 2024

February 4 – Sexagesima

Luke 8:5 – “And as he sowed, some fell along the path and was trampled underfoot ...” Know any farmers like this? Who just throws their crop seed wherever? That’s crazy! But God’s ways are not our ways — He is generous beyond compare! He delights in giving. As we are more and more conformed to His image, may we also learn the joy of generosity and giving!

February 11 – Quinquagesima

Luke 18:34 – “This saying was hidden from them, and they did not grasp what was said.” Even our understanding of the Word of God is a gift — the disciples can’t understand Jesus because it is not given to them to understand Him. By nature, they are deaf to the Word. So, everything we have is a gift of God. To realize this is the beginning of thankfulness, generosity and kindness.

February 14 – Ash Wednesday

Matthew 6:21 – “For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.” There’s the ultimate word on stewardship: your heart goes where you put the treasure which God has given you to manage in this life.

February 18 – Lent 1

Matthew 4:4 – “But he answered, ‘It is written, ‘Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God.’” What good are all the things of this world (food, drink, house, home, wealth, etc.) if we lose the things of God? What’s more important? How should our priorities be arranged?

February 25 – Lent 2

Matthew 15:27–28 – “She said, ‘Yes, Lord, yet even the dogs eat the crumbs that fall from their masters’ table.’ Then Jesus answered her, ‘O woman, great is your faith!’” Faith says “Yes” to all that the Lord gives us. The Canaanite woman trusted Jesus, and so she knew there was a blessing for her in everything the Lord says — even when His words seemed difficult or harsh. We all need a faith like that!

LIFE THOUGHTS FOR LUTHERANS – FEBRUARY 2024

Sexagesima – God’s Word does things, guaranteed (Isaiah 55:11)! That’s because God Himself works in and through His Word, accomplishing His will. His work through the Word made flesh changes hearts. That is why Lutherans For Life bases everything upon that Word. When hearts and minds are changed, people change. People changed and motivated by the Word can influence and bring change to our society. *Almighty Father, bring forth fruit from the seeds You plant in and through us. Amen.*

Quinquagesima – “[T]he Lord sees not as man sees: man looks on the outward appearance” (1 Samuel 16:7). Age, shape, and ability do not establish or inhibit human worth. “[T]he Lord looks on the heart” and sees the life and spirit hidden within. Every human pulse beats with the Creator’s own love – patient (1 Corinthians 13:4), enduring (1 Corinthians 13:7), making perfect (1 Corinthians 13:10) what was wrecked (Luke 18:42). *Dear Jesus, give us Your love that looks past appearances. Amen.*

Lent I (Invocabit) – Satan’s temptations of Jesus reveal his main tactic—make that which is bad look good. These days he spends much time making death look good; abortion is good and the way out of a difficult situation; assisted suicide is good and the way to relieve suffering. But death is not good! It is the curse of sin! It is our enemy. But just as Jesus defeated Satan, so He has defeated death. We can trust and live in His victory. *Jesus, may Your Word be ever on our hearts and lips that we might resist the snare of the devil. Amen.*

Lent II (Reminiscere) – We as God’s people regard it our privilege and delight to abstain from sexual immorality (1 Thessalonians 4:3-7). The eternal joys of godly relationships and bodily service to neighbors (1 Thessalonians 4:9) more than make up for whatever momentary gratification we forego. *Heavenly Bridegroom, captivate our hearts by Your self-giving love that we desire in body and soul to receive Your blessings and serve Your kingdom. Amen.*
