RELIGION: Our faith and knowledge about God's love through Jesus is strengthened through Word and Sacrament. We read the Bible stories: *Jesus Appears to Mary* & *The Emmaus Disciples.* We know that there are times when we don't always remember that Jesus lives for us today. We can and should joyfully tell others that there is no doubt that Jesus is alive, and therefore we will live with Him in heaven.

READING: Our stories this week were: *Hi! Fly Guy & Busy Bugs.* Our high frequency words were: caught, thought, took, beautiful, minute, friendship, listen and idea. We learned how to add the suffixes -ful, -ly, and -y to a base word. We learned that an adverb describes a verb. It tells us how, where, when, or how much.

MATH: We reviewed chapter 12 and started chapter 13. We learned that a whole has equal shares when the parts are the same size. We learned how to partition shapes into halves and fourths.

SCIENCE: We discussed how camouflage helps an animal hide from predators and catch their prey. We looked at different animals and had to determine how they use their unique camouflage.
