FROM THE PASTOR

The month of September has a good number of commemorations. Beginning with **Joshua** (Sept. 1) the successor to Moses who finally led Israel into Canaan, the promised land. **Hannah** (Sept. 2) was one of two wives of Elkanah and the mother of the prophet Samuel. Hannah was called barren, but her fervent prayer was heard, and her womb opened. This is part of an important biblical motif called "the barren womb motif" where God gives children to those thought to be unable to have them. **Gregory the Great** (Sept 3) lived during the sixth-century and was a pastor and bishop of Rome. He was known for his civil service and generosity, selling off the majority of his possessions to the assist the poor. **Moses** (Sept. 4) was the first of the great prophets who was instrumental in leading God's people out of captivity to Pharaoh. During the time of Israel's wandering Moses pleaded with God to forgive the people for their disobedience and unbelief. **Zacharias and Elizabeth** (Sept. 5) were the righteous parents of St. John the Baptist. Zacharias was a priest and a descendent of Aaron. Elizabeth was barren, until an angel visited her telling her she would bear a son. They are remembered as examples of patient faith and godliness.

Cyprian of Carthage (Sept. 16) was a third century pastor and martyr who helped forge a way for those who had fled under persecution to be restored to the Church. He also wrote many theological works that are still regarded to this day. **St. Matthew, Apostle and Evangelist** (Sept. 21), known by Levi in the Gospels, was originally a tax collector who was called by Jesus in chapter 9 of his own gospel. His gospel is the first to appear in the New Testament and he is known to have died a martyrs death. **Jonah** (Sept. 22) is remembered for calling Nineveh, the capital of the Assyrian Empire, to repentance. The three days Jonah spends in the belly of the fish portends to the three-day rest of Jesus in the tomb and is seen now as an allegory of the resurrection. **Jerome** (Sept. 30) was a scholar and translator of Holy Scripture. He is known for his translation of the scriptures called the Vulgate, which was in use in the church for over a thousand years. Let us give thanks for all these Christian confessors who, trusting in Christ, have won the victory.
