**RELIGION:** The Holy Spirit works through God's Word to strengthen our faith in Him. We read the Bible stories: *Jeremiah* and *Ezra Teaches the People*.

**READING:** Ours stories this week were: Animal Groups, Animal Picnic, Mike's Bike, The Nest, and The Nice Vet. Our sight words were: bird, both, eyes, fly, long, or, those, walk. We learned and practiced the sound that the long vowel "i" makes. We learned how to compare and contrast a text using a Venn diagram. We learned how to blend and decode words that have the letter: kn, wr, gn, mb. For example, when we say the words knock the letter "k" is silent.

MATH: We continued to explore and learn more about two-dimensional shapes. We took these two-dimensional shapes and created another two-dimensional shape by putting them together. We discussed and reviewed attributes of the different shapes. We made a 2-dimensional book. We then started learning about attributes of solids or 3-dimensional shapes.

SCIENCE: We reviewed that when the Earth rotates this causes day and night. When the Earth revolves around the Sun this causes the seasons. We discussed the winter season. We learned that in winter, it gets dark early, and the days feel shorter. We also talked about the snow and the cold air we feel in winter.

ART: We made snowflakes by folding and cutting a piece of white paper. We also made origami cardinals.
