**RELIGION:** God sends His followers out into the world to share the Gospel with others. We read the Bible stories: Jesus is Baptized and Tempted and Jesus Calls Matthew. We know that Jesus' forgiveness is for all people. We need to use our God-given abilities to serve God and His people.

READING: The stories in our anthology this week were: Tomas' Rivera and Life Then and Now. Our sight words this week were: done, paper, great, laugh, soon, talk, were, work. We worked on the vowel pairs "oa" and "ow". We learned the contractions for the words have and are. We learned that using the verbs "will" and "going to" tell us about the future. Please give your child extra practice for spelling words next week. They are compound words and can be very tricky to spell.

**MATH:** We continued to read and work through different strategies to solve word problems this week. We reviewed everything that we have learned in this chapter and took a test.

SOCIAL STUDIES: We learned about George Washington and Abraham Lincoln.

ART: We finished our snow globe stories and created a snow globe. We also learned about the artist Paul Klee. We looked at the different pictures that he created focusing on his use of line over different backgrounds. Paul Klee used color to create a mood (ex.: stormy or sunny). We drew a castle with line using a crayon and then used the technique wet-into-wet(dabbing colors and allowing them to run together) to create the background.
