<u>Literacy</u>

This week our time was devoted to completing our biographies. We have been sharing them in class and will be on display outside our classroom. They are simply amazing! To continue with our biography unit, we read *Now and Ben* and compared the inventions that Benjamin Franklin invented from long ago to what they are today. We read a Scholastic News about dolphins and their way of life. A review of long vowel words and a game with alphabetical order was also part of this weeks literacy time.

<u>Math</u>

We started our geometry unit. Names of 3-dimensional shapes and their attributes were discussed (face, edge, vertex). We also learned how to draw a cube! Naming 2-dimensional shapes according to their sides and vertices was practiced. Once we learned about angles, your second grader put their skills to the test by sorting shapes.
