Literacy

Our story this week was a folktale about how the chipmunk got his stripes. With the use of this story, we practiced summarizing and completed a character analysis. This reminded us how loud actions speak and tell us a lot about a character's personality. We also focused on contractions.

In writing, our first goal was to turn a wimpy sentence into a stronger sentence by the use of adjectives. Our next step was to pick out a silly animal picture and then write down several adjectives to describe the picture. With the use of these adjectives, a sentence was created.
