Literacy: This week we read the story *Luke goes to Bat*. We also learned about Jackie Robinson and the impact he had on Major League Baseball. We completed a short timeline of Jackie's life. Subject-verb agreement was practiced. We continue to practice strong answers as well as using context clues to determine the meaning of a word.

Math: This week we practiced counting dollar bills and learned how to write money using dollars and cents. We also began our time unit. The focus was on learning the hands of a clock, as well as telling time to the hour and half hour. Next week telling time to the nearest minute as well as quarter past and quarter to will be practiced. Just like money, this is a life skill and extra practice is beneficial.

Science: We completed oceans and the desert. Then reviewed for our test! The test will be coming home; however, it does not say "test." After this week we will be switching to Social Studies.

Religion: In the story about the Good Samaritan we are reminded that we are selfish and don't always love others as ourselves. This week we also read about Jesus at the home of Mary and Martha and how we are often like Martha. Unfortunately, we also get distracted and forget to put Jesus first.
